Summer School2440 SUMMER SCHOOL

The Board of Education may conduct a summer program of instruction for pupils enrolled in grades Pre-K through 12. The summer session must be approved by the County Superintendent and may include:

1. Remedial courses for pupils who wish to retake a course or subject previously taken and for which credits or placement may be awarded;
2. Advanced courses for pupils who wish to take a course or subject not previously taken and for which credits or placement may be awarded; and
3. Enrichment courses for pupils who wish to take a course or subject of avocational interest and for which no credits are awarded.

The Board directs the Superintendent to implement a suitable educational program to carry out this policy and to submit to the Board for its approval each proposed course of study.

Pupils eligible for the summer school of this district shall include resident pupils eligible for regular attendance in this district and pupils eligible by standards established by a governmental funding source, nonresident pupils whose age or grade level is appropriate to the course of study applied for, and summer residents of this district, provided that the attendance of such pupils will not preclude the attendance of resident pupils. No transportation shall be provided.

A pupil previously retained at grade level may be promoted upon successful completion of a required remedial course, but no pupil shall be required to attend summer school. Successful completion of remedial courses at other school systems and online educational systems may also be accepted by the school to satisfy course and/or graduation requirements.

A tuition fee will be charged to nonresident pupils enrolled in a summer school course and to resident pupils enrolled in enrichment courses determined by the County Superintendent to be unrelated to the regular school curriculum.

Summer School

No tuition shall be charged to pupils domiciled within the district for enrollment in remedial or advanced courses as per N.J.A.C. 6A:32-10.1. The district shall not pay registration, tuition, and other fees for coursework completed in other school systems or via online educational systems.

The Superintendent shall develop regulations for the summer school that include provisions for appropriate planning, proper staffing, pupil assignments, pupil evaluation, pupil records, award of credit, grade placement, and the utilization of facilities. Such regulations for the operation of the summer school shall be consistent with rules of the State Board of Education and Board policies, and the operation of summer school shall not conflict in any way with the administration of the regular school sessions of this district.
