Purpose: To recognize a hard working senior in Roxbury High School who demonstrates good moral character and a strong desire to attend an institution of higher learning.

Type: An award in the amount of \$1,000.00 shall be issued to the recipient upon certification of attendance at an institution of higher learning.

Basis of Award: The award shall be presented annually to a graduating senior who:

1. Has an acceptable academic record
2. Has a strong work ethic.
3. Has a financial need due to family income or other hardship
4. Is being graduated from Roxbury High School or is otherwise receiving a Roxbury High School diploma.

Method of Selection: The recipient shall be selected in the following manner:

A committee of Spitzer Family members will be appointed yearly by the foundation.

The committee will review the submitted applications and decide the student who will receive the scholarship.

Date of Award: Annually at Senior Awards Program
