

Career Pathway & CTE: Quick Facts

Career-related pathways, specifically CTE pathways, generally carry transferable credits and/or certifications.

Career-related education allows students to practice work skills and leadership skills before entering the workforce.

Career-related pathways have been shown to help focus students in their learning path, increasing the likelihood of graduation.

CTE students are more likely to attain certificates in post-secondary institutions than their traditional academic trajectory counterparts.

Mid to low-income students are more likely to begin their post-secondary preparation in CTE programs than those from the highest income bracket.

Impact of Dual Credit: Quick Facts

Dual credit is highly coorelated to postsecondary degree attainment

Dual credit courses have a higher positive impact on students who start at a community college

Dual credit has a significant impact on attainment of college completion is even higher for low socio-economic students

Dual credit enrollees earn higher grades in college than non-dual credit enrollees

Dual enrollment courses have been shown to cut down on the financial burden of college
