Roxbury school district formally accepted a vision of a "Portrait of a Graduate" in 2019. Roxbury public schools worked as a community to formalize its beliefs on the ways in which they fulfill their vision of "preparing the children of today for tomorrow" with a special focus on its Gael graduates. The committee formed six themes that collectively frame the skills and attributes necessary for life beyond Roxbury schools and capture the essence of the Portrait of a Graduate. These include Leadership, Emotional Intelligence, Active Citizens, Curious Thinkers, Adaptable \& Resilient, and Life Ready.

Our talented staff provides a challenging, yet supportive environment. In each of our seven schools, students enjoy experiences and opportunities that enable them to become productive young adults in an ever-changing world.
Roxbury School District is proud to be part of the inter-district school choice program for the Fine and Performing Arts with educational opportunities for students.

Roxbury High School is pleased to host the Sports Medicine Academy through the Morris County School of Technology. The Academy is part of the Morris County Vocational and Technical School District and provides students with a solid foundation in the growing fields of exercise science, fitness studies, physical therapy, athletic training, and injury prevention and treatment. This selective program is available to qualified students in and around Morris County.

## COMMUNITY:

Roxbury Township is located in western Morris County, New Jersey approximately forty miles west of New York City. Roxbury serves the communities of Succasunna, Kenvil, Ledgewood, Lower Berkshire Valley, Landing, Port Morris, and Flanders. The district is comprised of 22 square miles and has a population of approximately 24,000 residents. The town has five elementary schools, one middle school, and one high school with a total enrollment of 3,450 students.

## SCHOOL:

Established in 1902, Roxbury High school is a four-year comprehensive school offering curricular and co-curricular programs to 1230 students from Roxbury Township and Mt. Arlington. Currently, the demographic makeup of Roxbury High School is $50 \%$ male and $50 \%$ female. The student population ethnicity breakdown is $61.2 \%$ white, $5 \%$ Asian, $24.5 \%$ Hispanic, $5 \%$ Black, $4.3 \%$ other. $16.6 \%$ of the student population is classified as Students with Disabilities, 2\% are English Language Learners and $17 \%$ are identified as Economically Disadvantaged.

Roxbury High School has approximately 120 full time instructional staff and 45 non-instructional staff members. The student to administrator ratio is approximately 410 to 1 , and the student to counselor ratio is approximately 245 to 1 .

The school features a television studio, dance studio, pre-school, state of the art music facility, weight room, a new Athletic Training and Physical Therapy Lab, and a new Structural Design and Fabrication Facility.

The school's rigorous and comprehensive academic programs are further enhanced by a co-curricular program that includes 24 Varsity teams. Roxbury High School encourages students to participate in student activities and, as a result, we offer more than 30 clubs and activities.

## CURRICULUM:

Roxbury High School operates on a modified block schedule that offers the students a rigorous comprehensive curriculum in a challenging academic environment. The length of the school day is 6 hours and 47 minutes. The length of the class blocks are 75 minutes.

The instructional program provides the students with a wide variety of academic opportunities in order to meet the individual needs of the student. Our academic departments offer Advanced Placement, Dual Credit, Honors, and College Preparatory courses. For a complete listing of these courses, please visit the Program of Studies on our website.

## GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS:

To graduate from Roxbury High School, students must successfully earn 140 credits and receive a passing score on a State Endorsed Assessment. A full year course earns five credits. Honors and Advanced Placement Science courses earn six or seven credits. Students carry a minimum of 35 credits per year, or seven subjects each year.
