Enter Franklin School's Read Across America Week Book Cover Contest

Rules:

- Use an 8 ½ x 11 sheet of paper to recreate the cover of your favorite book. This does NOT need to be a Dr. Seuss book.
- The entire sheet must be covered to resemble your book cover
- Any drawing materials can be used- paint, marker, crayon, etc.
- All entries are due Wednesday, February 28, 2018 by the end of the school day. No late entries will be accepted.
- Put your name, teacher's name and grade on the BACK
- It must be your very best work. Please do all of the work yourself, we like to see how creative you are!
- Neatness of cover, spelling and penmanship all count towards who is chosen as the winner for each class, so do your best!
- Please submit your entries to your teacher

Kindergarten: A neatly completed book cover with the title of the book (not traced)

On the back of your cover, in pencil:

First graders must include: A sentence or two about their favorite part of the book

Second graders must include: Two to Five sentences about their favorite character in the book and why that is their favorite character

Third graders must include: A story retelling. Tell about the characters, setting, plot, events, problem, and resolution. You can create a story map or a simple graphic organizer to tell about these parts, or write sentences.

On a separate sheet of writing paper:

Fourth graders should write a book review. Tell about your book and tell others why they should read this book. You should be sure to include some of the story elements as well, it helps to get readers interested in some of the events.

The most important rule is that you HAVE FUN!
