- Last Thursday, 8th grader Isabella Reilly and her mother, as well as a representative from the Valerie Center, spoke to the entire school about the "Treasure Chest" at Morristown Memorial Hospital. The students and teachers were very attentive as they explained how a small toy or prize from the treasure chest can really lift the spirits of a young patient who has just had a procedure done. Most patients, through the years, forget the pain and trouble of their procedures but remember the special toys they got from the Treasure Chest. Isabella knows first hand what that is like as she is a cancer survivor.
- The purpose of this dance is to raise awareness to our students about childhood cancer and to "Make a kid's really bad day a lot better"!
- The Character Education Committee, with Mrs. Rodas and Mrs. Roddy, as well as the PTO will be holding a Winter Wonderland Fun Night and Dance on Friday, February 24 to benefit the Valerie Center Treasure Chest as Morristown Hospital. This fun night will be similar to our past events but all proceeds will be benefiting kids with cancer.

- Admission is either \$5 OR a donation to the treasure chest. There will be raffles, a DJ, face-painting, basketball, Just Dance, snacks & drinks. Tickets will be sold during lunch periods on Thursday and Friday, Feb. 23 & 24th.
